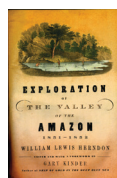


John Hemming

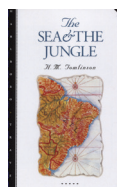


William Herndon, Gary Kinder (Editor)

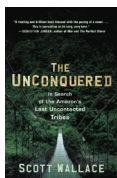


Mark Plotkin

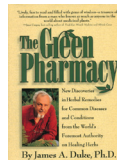

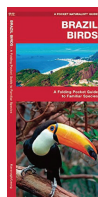
